

## A legacy of love


Born in 1928, Patricia Carmody had a passion for helping others. Having earned both a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in Social Work from Cardinal Stritch University, she dedicated her life to serving women, children and families with kindness and compassion highlighted by her 25 years as a social worker at

Catholic Charities.

She was a trusted guide and source of unwavering support, ensuring that birth mothers, young adoptees and foster families felt valued and respected. With her help, families received the essential care they needed, often taking them to appointments in her blue convertible.

Even decades later, Patricia's legacy endures. One birth mother, whom she guided through the adoption process 57 years ago, remembers her with deep gratitude. "She treated me with such dignity and respect. She was my rock during an uncertain time," the mother shared. Over the years, their bond grew into a cherished friendship.

Patricia passed away this past April at the age of 95, leaving behind not only treasured memories but also a lasting gift. Her bequest to Catholic Charities will continue to support birth mothers, families and adoptees, ensuring they receive the same care and compassion she so beautifully exemplified. Sabrina and Chris dreamed of providing a happy, stable life for their baby. But when they faced homelessness during Sabrina's pregnancy, that dream felt out of reach.

With help from Catholic Charities, they found hope. Carrie, a pregnancy support worker, helped them with their most immediate need to secure housing. Together, they made sure Sabrina's nutritional needs were taken care of and that she attended regular medical checkups. Carrie also provided pregnancy and birth planning education so that Sabrina could advocate for her own health care.

After their baby was born, Sarah, a family support worker, guided them through the early days of parenting, offering practical advice and encouragement. During her home visits, Sarah helped Sabrina and Chris learn how to provide loving care for their little one.

"We're on the right track now," says Chris. "Catholic Charities opened our eyes to everything new parents need to learn."
